Senior schooling



The Department of Education states:

Students in Years 11 and 12 require self-motivation and selfmanagement. For success, senior students need to have:

- a regular study routine
- excellent time management skills
- an ability to prioritise.



The school's *Adjusting to senior schooling* program deals with <u>study skills</u> and <u>learning goals</u>....


then

....for each student, these are recorded as a <u>learning</u> <u>profile</u>.



The school has also outlined its *seriousness expectations* through a....

traffic-lights levels system.



The system is based on information gathered in <u>5-week periods</u>....

Information includes:

- unexplained absences
- N-letters issued
- assessment scores
- effort grades in reports
 and
- teacher comments on patterns of classwork and H/W.



Based on this information, each student is placed on **one of three levels...**



- no significant seriousness issues
- most students on this level
- no follow-up action needed
- level lasts for 5 weeks

green level



some seriousness issues:

- multiple or significant
- Year Adviser interview, discussing:
 - issues of concern
 - need to fix, in next 5-week period
 - support needed?
 - need to adjust study routine or learning goals?
- parents informed
 - letter and phone call
- level lasts for 5 weeks

yellow level



red level

- continued seriousness issues:
 - multiple or significant
 - Deputy Principal interview, discussing:
 - issues of concern
 - need to fix, in next 5-week period
 - support needed?
 - need to adjust study routine or learning goals?
 - required attendance at catch-up sessions:
 - cancelled early-leaving days
 - after-school Homework Help (M/T)
 - parents informed
 - letter and phone call
- level lasts for 5 weeks



continued red level

- continued seriousness issues:
 - AND/OR failure to attend catch-up sessions
 - Deputy Principal interview, discussing:
 - issues of concern
 - longer-term, serious school-leaving consequences after age of 17
 - required attendance at catch-up sessions:
 - as before
 - parents informed
 - letter and phone call, requesting parent meeting with the Deputy
- level lasts until issues fixed

Some points to note....

- All students begin the school year on green level.
- Levels normally change <u>one at a</u> <u>time</u>.
- Levels decisions made by Deputy Principal, with welfare staff input.
- <u>No time extension</u> on yellow level.
- Letters sent for <u>yellow or red levels</u> <u>only</u>; green level may be assumed, unless otherwise notified.
- In 2025, this system to operate for <u>Year 11 only</u>, commencing in Term 2.
